1. This Music Teacher of the Year Awards aim to recognise the nation's most inspirational music teachers. An entry to the competition comprises a completed entry form, accompanied by a CD or DVD of a musical performance by the pupils of the school which is signed by the nominee and the nominating party. The initial online form asking for entrants to put forward a name does not constitute as an entry. All nominations that are received via this method will then be contacted and the nominee will be invited to fill in the full entry form. 2. CDs and DVDs themselves must be clearly labelled with the name and contact details of the nominee as well as the case in which they are enclosed. Unfortunately, entries cannot be returned.
3. Copyright in any original work(s) embodied in the CD and/or DVD submitted will remain with the owner. 4. There are six categories:

 - Newly qualified music teacher

5. Full entries must be received by the closing date - 6pm on 4 October, 2010. Classic FM is not responsible for delays in the post. It is recommended that entries are sent by recorded post.
6. The six category winners will be those music teachers who have shown through their entries that they have made the greatest difference to the musical life of their school. If the judges believe that they can not declare a winner for a category then they have the right not to award the prize. The judges decision will be final.
7. The judging panel will comprise of representatives from Classic FM, Classic FM Magazine, Music For Youth, Avid Sibelius, Yamaha, music teaching, and any other judges from within the field at Classic FM's discretion.
8. The winning music teachers and their entries may be used by Classic FM and Avid Sibelius in publicity relating to the competition. They and their entries may be featured on Classic FM, the competition website, in interviews, photographs and other media.
9. Classic FM will notify the winners of their selection following the judging.
10. The winners will be presented with their prize at the Music For Youth Schools Prom at the Royal Albert Hall between the 8-10 November 2010. The competition organisers will pay for travel expenses for the winner and a guest.
11. The Classic FM Music Teacher of the Year Awards are open to all UK schools-based and peripatetic music teachers.
12. For the purposes of this competition, 'primary schools' are those teaching Key Stage Two and below. 'Secondary schools' are those teaching Key Stage Three and above, as recognised by the Department for Education.
13. Nominees must be a resident of the United Kingdom. Employees of Global Radio, Avid Sibelius Yamaha, their families, press, agencies or any persons directly or indirectly connected with this Competition are not eligible to enter the Competition. Global Radio reserves the right to verify the eligibility of all entrants.
